

Purchase a Paver. Honor a Veteran!

The Walk of Remembrance at the Cupertino Veterans Memorial in Memorial Park allows you to purchase a paver in honor of anyone who has served, including MIAs and POWs, or is currently serving in the U.S. military. **The veteran need not have lived in Cupertino to be part of the Walk of Remembrance.** In addition, schools, organizations, businesses, and individuals can purchase pavers with messages honoring veterans.

Please print clearly the wording you would like on the paver. All characters (including spaces, no punctuation) will be engraved on lines of 15-30 spaces each.

\$250 pavers 7 1/2" x 7 1/2" = **15 characters** on each line - 3 lines

\$500 pavers 7 1/2" x 7 1/2" = **15 characters** on each line - 6 lines

\$600 pavers 7 1/2" x 7 1/2" = **15 characters** on each line - 3 lines and a 4" military emblem or US flag

\$1,000 pavers 12" x 12" = **30 characters** on each line - 6 lines plus one 5" military emblem or US flag (\$100 for additional emblem)


The difference in cost reflects the size and placement of the pavers. Your donation secures your paver or pavers on a first-come first-served basis. When I receive your order I will place the wording on a template and return it to you for approval before sending it to the engraver. We thank you for your support and your donation.
