## Purchase a Paver. Honor a Veteran!

Please print clearly the wording you would like on the paver. All characters (including spaces, no punctuation) will be engraved on lines of 15-30 spaces each.

**\$250** pavers 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " = **15 characters** on each line - 3 lines

\$500 pavers  $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " = 15 characters on each line - 6 lines

**\$600** pavers 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ " = **15 characters** on each line - 3 lines and a 4" military emblem or US flag **\$1,000** pavers 12" x 12" = **30 characters** on each line - 6 lines plus one 5" military emblem or US flag (\$100 for additional emblem)

The difference in cost reflects the size and placement of the pavers. Your donation secures your paver or pavers on a first-come first-served basis. When I receive your order I will place the wording on a template and return it to you for approval before sending it to the engraver. We thank you for your support and your donation.
